FOREWORD

If you are new to the experience of functioning as a delegate at a Lutheran Church-Canada convention, or have attended before and wish to refresh your "delegate skills," permit me these lines to introduce this initial edition of *Today's Business*. It's an important document to read and bring along to the Eleventh Convention of the Synod, scheduled for October 13-16, 2017, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Kitchener.

This booklet builds on the larger *Convention Workbook*, which you should have received (electronically or will receive at Convention in a print edition). If you studied your way through that book, you'll notice that the pages were numbered by categories in Sections A-F. The Workbook Supplement was entitled G. Now this first edition of *Today's Business* picks up where the *Workbook & Supplement* left off, starting with Section H. After you arrive at the Convention, there will be new editions of *Today's Business* distributed each morning. They will carry on the numbering pattern with Sections I, J, and so forth. If you keep all of them with you every day in the proper sequence, you'll have the documents you need to stay informed and to follow the various reports, greetings, and business items coming before our assembly.

This first *Today's Business* goes beyond the information we had available when the original *Convention Workbook* appeared in August. It also provides updates and, in some cases, corrections that became necessary after the *Workbook* was published.

Section F of the original *Workbook* listed all the "overtures," or requests for action received from congregations, boards, commissions, and other authorized groups by the appropriate deadline. The Workbook Supplement provided additional Overtures, along with other items. Resolutions Committees met in Winnipeg in mid-September to process those overtures. On the basis of them, they compiled the resolutions you find in this booklet. These resolutions are the Committees' recommendations on how the Convention might handle the matters addressed in the overtures. To be sure, these resolutions may be adopted, amended, or even turned down by the Convention. They do, however, provide at least a starting point for our deliberations.

During the course of the Convention, some resolutions may be changed because of the discussions we will have, or because of instructions the assembly gives to the appropriate Resolutions Committee. This is another reason there will be further editions of *Today's Business* each morning. Although they will be briefer than this booklet, those editions will provide "the latest" if a particular resolution has been revised.

Synod's bylaws give this guidance on processing resolutions:

"Any member of Lutheran Church-Canada and any lay delegate to the Convention wishing to express comments on reports and overtures appearing in the Convention Workbook may submit these in triplicate at least seven weeks prior to the Convention to the Secretary of the Synod, who shall submit them to the appropriate convention committee for consideration. Responses to the tentative resolutions contained in the first issue of <u>Today's Business</u> shall be submitted in triplicate to the chairman of the appropriate floor committee at least one week prior to the Convention. All floor committees shall meet at the convention site at a time prior to the opening of the Convention to review such responses and reconsider their tentative resolutions accordingly." (Bylaw 2.19g, 2011 Handbook, Page 22)

Installation of Convention Delegates and Official Opening of Convention

(Voting and advisory delegates and representatives rise)

President:

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Since you are to serve as representatives of the pastors, teachers and congregations of the synod, as well as for its various boards, agencies and institutions, and so that your participation in this convention may be to the glory of God and serve as a blessing to His church, I ask you to hear this Word of God.

In the 12th chapter of St. Luke we read of Jesus speaking to His disciples: "Be dressed, ready for service and keep your lamps burning, like men waiting for their master.. Who then is the faithful and wise manager, whom the master puts in charge of his servants to give them their food allowance at the proper time? It will be good for that servant whom the master finds doing so when he returns."

In 2 Timothy, chapter 1, St. Paul writes, "What you have heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching, with faith and love in Christ Jesus. Guard the good deposit that was entrusted to you -- guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us."

I therefore ask you: Do you solemnly promise before God and this Christian assembly that, as delegates to this convention, you will be obedient to the Word of God and will faithfully uphold the confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, so that in unity of faith and in the fellowship of love the Church may grow into Him who is the head, Jesus Christ?

Delegates: Yes, with the help of God.

PRAYERS (The assembly rises for prayer)

President: Let us pray.

Guide us, Lord, by your Holy Spirit, so that this synodical convention may promote your work among us and build up your holy church. Lord, in your mercy:

H. 3 Hear our prayer.

Direct all our discussion and debate, so that we may discern your will for us and make right decisions on the matters before us.

Lord, in your mercy:

Hear our prayer.

Keep our focus on your commands and promises to us, so that we maybe bold in our mission to the people of this land.

Lord, in your mercy:

Hear our prayer.

Make us ready to listen, slow to criticize, and willing to cooperate with each other, so that we may promote the unity which you have given us. Lord, in your mercy:

Hear our prayer.

Encourage and inspire us through this convention, so that we may be better equipped to serve you as your priestly people; through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

OPENING

I now declare this Eleventh Synodical Convention of Lutheran Church-Canada open, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

BLESSING

The Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has called us and committed to us the gospel of his grace, increase your love for one another and all people.

Amen.

CONVENTION ORIENTATION

I. INTRODUCTION

II. SYNOD AND ITS MEMBERS

- 2.1 Lutheran Church–Canada is organized as a Synod, i.e. its members voluntarily walk with each other on the same road. Members of Synod are congregations, pastors and deacons. These members constituted Lutheran Church–Canada in 1988. Lutheran Church–Canada subsequently established districts. Districts in turn create circuits.
- 2.2 The relationship of Synod to its members is advisory. It can urge its members to take a certain action but cannot mandate them. Synod can, however, terminate membership.
- 2.3 The relationship of Synod to its districts is not advisory. It can mandate its districts to take certain action.

III. ROLE OF THE CONVENTION

- 3.1 To celebrate the grace of God and grow in faith and sanctification.
- 3.2 To become better informed concerning the needs, challenges and opportunities facing Synod.
- 3.3 To receive the reports of the officers, boards and commissions of Synod.
- 3.4 To make decisions regarding directions for the church.
- 3.5 To elect officers, boards and commissions.

IV HOW THE CONVENTION ARRIVES AT DECISIONS

- 4.1 Officers, boards and other entities report to Synod on activities, needs, challenges.
- 4.2 Congregations and certain other entities submit proposals for action (overtures).
- 4.3 Special resolutions committees are appointed by the president to review all reports and overtures and submit appropriate resolutions. These resolutions, not the reports or overtures, are voted on by the convention.

V. ORDER

- 5.1 All those issued special badges are asked to wear them at all times.
- 5.2 Voting delegates, and only voting delegates, are to be seated in the section reserved for them. Voting delegates will not be allowed to vote if they are not seated in the prescribed area. (Exception: voting delegates who serve on committees will receive ballots if their presence is required elsewhere.)
- 5.3 Advisory delegates, and only advisory delegates, are to be seated in the section reserved for them. There is also a special area for Special Guests and Registered Visitors.
- 5.4 Voting delegates have voice and vote; advisory delegates have voice only, they may not make or second a motion.
- 5.5 Others are not allowed to speak on the floor, unless by special permission.
- Voting will be done by a show of hands. A standing counted vote (division) may be called for. All elections will be by ballot.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

- 6.1 Announcements are to be put in writing and handed to the secretary or convention manager.
- 6.2 Prayer requests are to be put in writing and handed to the chaplain or handed in at the information booth.
- 6.3 Please return to your seats as promptly as possible after the scheduled breaks.
- 6.4 The Committee for Communication and Technology has official responsibility for media contacts.
- 6.5 Please remember to turn off your cell phone when on the convention floor.

VII. PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

- 7.1 The purpose of parliamentary procedure is to assure that the will of the majority prevails, but that the rights of the minority are protected.
- 7.2 The role of the chair is to ensure that there is an orderly consideration of issues; that the opinions of the majority and the minority are heard while remaining impartial. The chair must ensure that delegates understand the action they are voting on, and what options are open to them. (If you have any doubts, ask!)
- 7.3 The responsibility of delegates is to be informed on issues, and vote according to their conscience. Do not be afraid to ask questions.
- 7.4 A review of parliamentary procedure is found on page H 4.

SUBSTITUTE MOTIONS, ACCORDING TO ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER

Note: A substitute motion should be introduced only if the same objective cannot be accomplished through simpler means.

- 1 A proposed resolution is first introduced and stated by the chair (the "pending resolution").
- 2 A substitute resolution is introduced and stated by the chair (the "substitute resolution").
- Debate begins with the pending resolution (but may include references to the substitute resolution). Amendments to the pending resolution may be offered.
- Debate continues with the substitute resolution (but may include references to the pending resolution). Amendments to the substitute resolution may be offered.
- When debate has ended, the assembly is asked, "shall the substitute resolution be substituted for the pending resolution?" A vote is taken.
- 6a If the vote is **affirmative**, the pending resolution is no longer before the assembly. There may be further discussion on the substitute motion, limited amendments, after which a vote is taken on the adoption of the substitute motion.
- 6b If the vote is **negative**, the substitute motion is no longer before the assembly. There may be further discussion on the pending motion, with limited amendments, after which a vote is taken on the adoption of the pending resolution.

Delegate Seating

All voting delegates and only voting delegates are to be seated in the section reserved for voting delegates. No visitors or spouses are allowed in this area. Advisory delegates are to be seated in the space reserved for advisory delegates. A section is also set aside for those registered as registered visitors. Additional seating is provided for official guests, press and visitors.

Distribution of Materials

Delegates and visitors are not to distribute any materials within the convention hall, or at the entrances to the convention hall, unless the secretary of the Synod has authorized such distribution. This regulation is not intended to limit freedom of expression, but to reduce the possibility that delegates might confuse materials which are part of official convention business with those of an unofficial nature. The cooperation of all delegates and visitors is appreciated.

Electronics

To avoid interruption of the business sessions all cell phones must be turned off unless absolutely necessary in which case they should be set to silent or vibrate mode and conversations conducted outside the convention room.

Due to cost, we are unable to provide power for laptop computers. If you are using a laptop, smart phone, or tablet device we ask that you confine its use to convention business so as not to distract other delegates, guests and visitors.

Convention Arrangements

Airport Transportation

Please make sure you have entered your arrival and departure information in the on line registration system.

By email you will receive confirmation of your arrival information and detailed instructions regarding shuttle service from the airport to Kitchener.

Buses will return you to the airport following the final business session and lunch.

Opening Worship, Friday, October 13

Opening worship is at Historic St. Paul's Lutheran Church 137 Queen Street S, Kitchener, ON at 7:30 p.m.

Nominations

The following are the procedures for offering additional nominations at the convention.

In the case of nominations for president or vice-president:

The delegates may, by majority vote, amend the slate for either of these two positions. This would be done at the time the slate is presented to the convention. A motion to amend the slate requires the majority approval of the voting delegates. If a delegate intends to follow this procedure, it is important to have the prior consent of the person who is to be added to the ballot by means of the amendment. For further information, check Bylaws 2.503f and 2.513f.

In the case of nominations for other positions:

Any voting delegate may, through a simple nomination, add candidates for any of the other offices, boards or commissions. This would be done at the time the slate is presented by the Committee on Nominations. Again, the consent of the person who is to be nominated should be obtained in advance. For further information, check Bylaw 2.529a.

Basic Parliamentary Law

The basic goal of parliamentary law is to ensure that the will of the majority prevails while the rights of the minority are protected. It is not the purpose of parliamentary procedure to make the conduct of business difficult, but to expedite it in a fair and orderly manner.

Once a motion is made, seconded, and stated by the chair, delegates are free to speak to that motion. If you agree with the motion, the best response is to vote for its adoption. You are free to speak, but you don=t have to. If you do not agree with the motion, the best and simplest response is to vote it down or you may do any (or all) of the following in the order listed:

postpone indefinitely Rarely used, except for procedural or tactical reasons.

amend To change an existing motion by: deleting, inserting, deleting

and inserting, and substituting.

substitute A substitute motion is really a form of an amendment, but one in

which the entire thrust and content of the resolution is changed. This is a more complex device and should be used only if desired

results cannot be attained by simpler means.

back to the committee, with or without special instructions.

postpone definitely To postpone action to a certain time.

table To set a matter aside and take no action. When a resolution is

tabled, it is effectively killed, without the delegates deciding for

or against it.

If you think there has been enough, (or too much) debate, and you would like to get on with the vote, you may do one of two things, in this order:

limit debate For a time limit or limit debate to a certain number of speeches.

terminate debate Same as Amove the previous question@ or "call the question." If

this motion passes by a 2/3 majority, the convention must

immediately vote on the motion before it.
