Dear Brothers from the Lutheran Church-Canada!

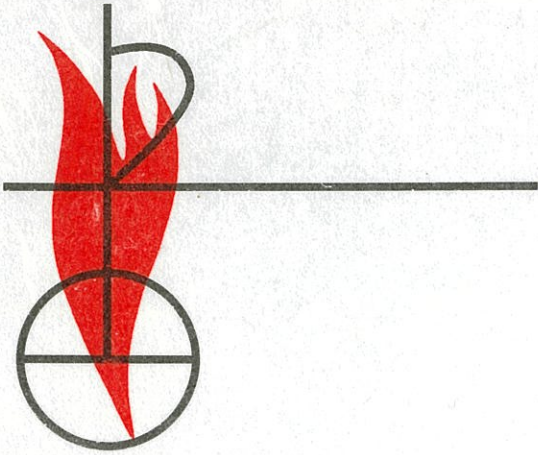
Since it is not possible for us to be present at the 11th Convention of your church, we wish you God's richest blessings as you gather with the theme: "Christ Alone, Christ Forever."

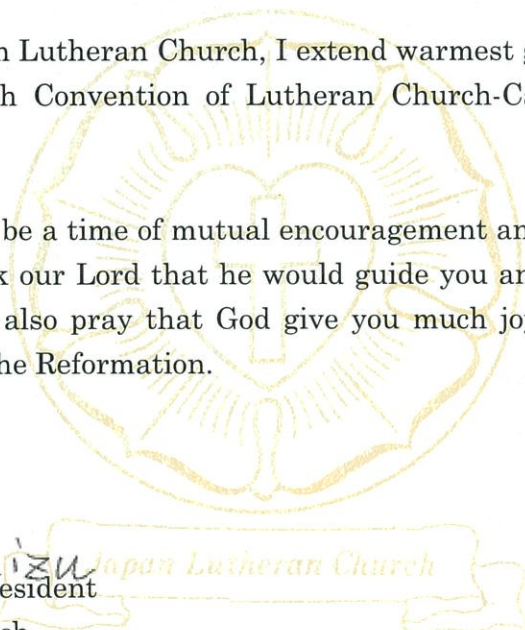

Resolution 17.2.05a TO ESTABLISH UNIFIED PROCEDURES FOR CALLING PASTORS (REVISED)

Ref. Overture 2.05

WHEREAS a congregation needs a pastor to be their shepherd and to fulfill all of the duties in service to our Lord for His flock; and

WHEREAS Scripture clearly teaches and instructs us regarding such a pastor as in 1 Tim. 2:11-14, 1 Cor. 14:33-40, and in other passages; and

WHEREAS the calling of a pastor is a solemn act into a solemn position; and

WHEREAS all our congregations are to be unified in both doctrine and practice; and

WHEREAS our congregations request guidelines for the calling of a pastor; and

WHEREAS our prayers, guidance, and direction in a calling process must be led by God, our Holy Spirit and not through the directions of man; and

Therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Council of Presidents establish a procedure for the calling of a pastor to a congregation, seeking God's blessings, and unifying all congregations and pastors in the act of issuing a solemn call to a shepherd in service to them and to the Lord.

Addendum to Earlier Reports**

LUTHERAN HISTORICAL INSTITUTE

At the 2015 the ABC District Convention an overture was passed with the intent of gifting the Lutheran Historical Institute (LHI) to LCC. For a time, this was impossible, since the court in the CCAA process prohibited the District from divesting itself of LHI until certain questions were clarified regarding its value.

In October of 2015 the LHI was released by the courts from the list of assets of the ABC District, as they had no commercial monetary value. At our March 2016 meeting the LCC Board of Directors (BOD) was informed that the LHI materials had been moved into a storage locker. The BOD was examining options for the housing and ongoing care of the materials once they became the property of LCC. There was concern on the part of the BOD as the expense of housing the LHI, and paying an Archivist, was an expense LCC was unable to assume at the time. One option, suggested by the ABC District, involved donating the materials to the Alberta Provincial Archives. On June 16, 2017 Grace Henderson, Rev. Tom Kruesel, Rev. Dr. Glenn Schaeffer and Bill Fraser (Chairman, ABC District BOD) met with Tom Anderson and his immediate supervisor. Mr. Anderson is the archivist responsible for private collections at the Provincial Archives. After this visit, the recommendation was made to the BOD to transfer the LHI to the care of the Provincial Archives. This action was taken at the BOD meeting in July of 2017. Several participating entities (LAMP, Concordia University Edmonton, Concordia Lutheran Seminary of Edmonton and the Lutheran Layman's League) had their materials returned to them as they decided this would be in their best interests. The transfer of remaining materials is now complete, and the tasks of cataloguing and preserving the collection will continue under the direction of Tom Anderson. The materials are currently available to the public. As it will take some time to reorganize the materials, people are asked to contact the Archives and discuss accessing the materials before just dropping in.

LCC owes a major debt of gratitude to Grace Henderson, Janice Ruf and Candace Rivet for the hours and hours of work they have done in sorting and preparing the material for transfer to the Provincial Archives.
